



Ted Horwood Reserve has two emergency entrance/exit points for Emergency vehicles and patient transport vehicles.

Ted Horwood Access points

Access 1: Park Road, Baulkham Hills

Provides emergency access to TH1, TH2, TH3, children's playground, netball courts and tennis courts





Access 2: Renown Road, Baulkham Hills. Opposite Baulkham Hills Sports Club. NOTE: Drive to the end of the car park to gain field access. Provides emergency access to TH4 and TH5





Emergency vehicles:

When an ambulance is called send someone to both access points to direct the ambulance into the park, or re-direct the ambulance to the correct entry to the park.

Ambulances unfamiliar with our area often mistakenly go to the wrong entrance. It is important that someone is at both entrances to assist ambulance drivers.

- Wear a ground official or team official fluoro vest for high visibility.
- Stand safely on the edge of the roadway, be as visible as possible.



ACCESS 1 PARK ROAD

Have an additional person wait at the field end of the track to direct the ambulance to the emergency.

- Ensure the gate on field 2 is unlocked (for incidents on TH 2 or TH3)
- Communicate with the referee to stop play on TH 2 if emergency vehicle is required on TH3.
- Monitor pedestrian movement in the precinct while the ambulance is moving.

ACCESS 2 RENOWN ROAD

- Ensure the emergency gate to TH 4 & 5 is unlocked.
- Have an additional person wait at the end of the car park to direct the ambulance to the emergency.
- Monitor pedestrian movement in the precinct while the ambulance is moving.

Patient transport vehicles:



The patient may be stable enough not to require an ambulance, but too incapacitated to walk or move without further distress.

They may need to be assisted from the field by private vehicle.

Do not move the patient.

Notify a club official and follow the appropriate steps above to ensure vehicle movement within the park precinct is safe.

IMPORTANT

In all cases where an injured or incapacitated person requires medical assistance or vehicular assistance to leave the field, play should not continue.

Patients should not be coerced into moving so play may resume. The patient is the priority.
